#### **BUDGET REPORT**

The House and Senate Conference Committee agreed to a final FY15 budget and both chambers passed the final budget on Tuesday, Day 39. The FY15 budget now awaits Governor Deal's signature.

#### Budgetary items affecting Georgia Tech:

- \$1.7M in bonds for planning and design of the Library/Crosland Tower renewal project
- \$4.5M in bonds for the Environmental Health and Safety Operations Facility

- \$40M in bonds to be allocated among USG institutions for major repairs and renovations
- \$47.37M in new formula funds to be allocated among USG institutions for critical operations, including \$11.4M for the merit based salary increase pool for USG employees
- \$8.97M in bonds to support research through the Georgia Research Alliance
- \$9.4M to increase the HOPE Scholarship factor rate by 3%

#### **Legislative Roundup**

#### Final Status of Bills and Resolutions from our Watchlist

HB 788 ...... Passed, Sent to Governor

Extends existing tax-exemption of USG property to private partners who operate student housing and other services for public colleges and universities.

HB 743 ......Passed, Signed by Governor Act 347

Amended Fiscal Year 2014 appropriations bill.

HB 744 ......Passed, Sent to Governor

General appropriations bill for Fiscal Year 2015.

HB 697 ......Passed, Sent to Governor

Extends Technical College student HOPE grants to cover full tuition.

HB 875 ...... Will not move forward this session

Changes current provisions relating to the carrying of weapons and maintains the prohibition of concealed carry on college campuses. Reduces the penalty for permit holders carrying weapons on campuses to a fine of no more than \$100.

HB 60 ...... Passed, Sent to Governor

Revises provisions for certain judges to obtain weapons carry licenses. Amended to allow permit holders to carry weapons in some locations <u>but not on college campuses</u>.

HR 1124.....Passed and adopted

Recognizes Georgia Tech Alumnus, Dr. Allen Ecker, for his contributions to economic development in Georgia.

HR 1265 ...... Passed and adopted

Creates the House Study Committee on Autonomous Vehicle Technology.
